HOME SCHOOL Students:

Home school students are permitted to take **Advanced Placement [AP] & Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test / National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test [PSAT/NMSQT]** exams in public schools where they are administered. Publication of dates of the administration are to be posted on school websites where applicable. [TCA 49-6-3050(f)]

Independent home school students who are in grade 5 or 7 can take TN Ready achievement tests at the public school for which they would normally be zoned. Contact is normally made in early second semester of the school year using current database lists obtained from the Sumner County Attendance Department, where home school registrations are made. That contact relates procedural guidelines to be followed by parents. [TCA 49-6-3050(b)5(A&B)]

Independent home school students who are in grade 9 taking Algebra I and/or English I [*specifically named courses*] can take TN Ready end-of-course tests at the public school for which they would normally be zoned during the spring testing window. Contact is normally made in early second semester of the school year using current database lists obtained from the Sumner County Attendance Department, where home school registrations are made.
