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Special Interest Camps Overview

WHO: Open to all Sumner County high school students entering grades 9-12 for the 2023-24 school year.

WHAT: Special Interest Camps are offered in a variety of areas across all Sumner County high schools. **Students may attend camp at any high school** (for example: a student at White House High School can attend a camp at Gallatin High School).

WHEN: Camps are offered 4 days/week (Monday-Thursday) and can be 1, 2, 3, or 4 weeks in length. Camps are offered between June 5 and June 29. See detailed descriptions on the following pages to see when specific camps are offered.

Special Interest Camps are either 8:00-11:15 or 12:15-3:30 from Monday-Thursday of each week. If students register for camps during the morning and afternoon of the same week, lunch is NOT provided. Transportation will also not be provided.

WHERE: All Sumner County high schools are offering Special Interest Camps this summer. Please review detailed camp descriptions on the following pages to find out what is offered at each high school.

Session Narrative/Overview: This will be an introduction to design using principles in the two types of software. In Canva, the basics for creating professional looking presentations, logos or promoting social media campaigns for education or awareness will be used for project-based learning. Publisher will cover the basics of design work using images and implementing text to create digital documents used in school and the business world.

Session Narrative/Overview: Creation of textile and paper items using the Japanese dyeing technique, Shabori, that results in rich patterns using indigo dye. While in between steps in the dyeing process, students will also create cyanotypes (also called sun prints).

Session Narrative/Overview: Ever had to build a mini-catapult? Cracked a secret code? Mixed a potion based on a logic puzzle recipe? Built the tallest tower out of spaghetti noodles? Plotted a course on a map to find a hidden treasure? ADVENTURES IN S.T.E.M. is one part in-school scavenger hunt, one part quiz bowl, one part game show designed to encourage groups of students to think critically and creatively outside of the normal classroom environment. The fun daily challenges are meant to foster camaraderie and teamwork, build on academic and STEAM skills and just generally be an enjoyable, extra-curricular challenge for kids that might not normally participate in group activities beyond the school day. Each awesome challenge involves PROBLEM SOLVING, CREATIVITY, INQUIRY SKILLS, MATH & SCIENCE SKILLS, ENGINEERING/DESIGN THINKING, CRITICAL THINKING and COLLABORATION.
